
Toyohashi City Multicultural Coexistence Promotion Plan (2024-2028 Fiscal Years) 豊橋市多文化共生推進計画(英語)

- Goal: To systematically and comprehensively promote more effective multicultural coexistence policies that are in line with our current situation Period: The five-year period from the start of the 2024 fiscal year until the end of the 2028 fiscal year (April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2029)
- Position: Under the city's principal "Toyohashi City Comprehensive Plan," we've taken into account Toyohashi's characteristic multicultural society, the city's accomplishments and issues faced up to now, reviewed trends in Aichi prefecture and Japan as a whole, collected various proposals, opinions, etc., from expert conferences in the city, and systematically integrated it all into one plan.


The Current State of Toyohashi's Multicultural Society

The City's Japanese Population and Total Population



Compared to 2013, the total population in Toyohashi has decreased by 10,348 people, but the population of Japanese nationals is decreasing at a higher rate. The number of Japanese residents has decreased by 15,795 during the same period.


Evolution of Toyohashi's Foreign Population



Records of Foreign Residents by Nationality (as of April 1 of each year)

Characteristic of Toyohashi is its diversity, with residents who were citizens of 76 different countries as of April 1, 2023 (excluding Japan). The population has increased over time, lessening the extent of the decreasing general population.

Compared to the foreign population in Japan as a whole, a large percentage of Toyohashi's foreign residents have status-based residence visas (Permanent Resident, Long-term Resident, etc.), and therefore many are permitted to reside here long term.

2. Promoting the Improvement of Our Living Environment

We are promoting the preparation of a living environment in which consultations are available and information is provided in multiple languages, one in which children can improve academically even if they don't know Japanese, so that Japanese residents and residents from abroad can live safe. healthy lives.

Consideration and implementation of policies aimed at expanding multilingual support at medical facilities

Improving support for foreign residents

- ◆ Providing information on childcare support in "Yasashii Nihongo"
- Administration of early education classes for children of foreign residents
- Consideration and implementation of policies to support Japanese language education in coordination with municipal junior high schools, Toyohashi high schools, night schools, related prefectural high schools, etc.

We train individuals to support foreign residents in becoming integrated members of society, and promote the fostering of a dynamic society in which both Japanese citizens and foreign résidents can flourish. This is possible when foreign residents can be independent and demonstrate their talents and individuality.
